

Complement - a therapeutic target for stroke and ALS

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The complement system is a part of the innate immune system that protects the host against pathogens. Over the years, Marcela and others have identified novel functions of the complement system in neural plasticity, regeneration and responses of the brain in neurological diseases. The lecture will highlight recent findings from the Pekna laboratory that point to the complement C3a receptor as an attractive target for therapies aiming at improving recovery after ischemic stroke and slowing down the progression of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis.
